Regular visits can make all the difference in your pet's quality of life. That's why we created our Wellness Program.

Program includes:

- ◆ Physical exam
- ◆ Comprehensive blood panel
- ◆ Heartworm test
- ◆ Dental exam and cleaning
- ◆ Routine fecal exam
- ◆ Urinalysis

- ◆ Vaccinations (as needed)
- ◆ Parasite control (as needed)

Physical exam - This is the most important part of your pet's care. A good physical will tell the doctor many things about your pet.

Comprehensive blood panel - this blood test will check the chemistries and blood component to see if your pet has problems in any of the major organs, bone marrow or thyroid.

Heartworm test - check for the presence of Heartworm disease which can be fatal if left untreated. Also tests for Lyme disease and Ehrlichia disease in dogs. Both of these diseases are transmitted by ticks.

Dental exam & cleaning - Proper dental care is extremely important for the overall health of your pet. Various experts state that 85-95% of all pets over 3 years of age have significant dental and periodontal disease. Unless prevented or treated, these diseases will decrease the quality of your pet's life and may even shorten it.

Fecal exam - this test will allow us to determine if any internal parasites are present. You should be aware of the public health significance associated with internal parasites.

Urinalysis - The analysis of a urine sample is very helpful in detecting disease or infection in your pet's kidneys.

Vaccinations - Regular immunizations are an important part of preventive health care.

Parasite control - Fleas, ticks and internal parasites (i.e. tapeworms or roundworms) can decrease the quality of life for your pet. There are effective and affordable remedies.

We also recommend that you consider these additional tests and procedures:

Microchipping - If your pet is ever lost without visible identification a microchip can identify them if they go to a shelter, humane society police station or veterinary hospital.
